Welcome to 2023

Welcome to 2023 and maybe the first year that will count as “normal” in the post COVID world. We are getting used to being close to avoiding COVID as we would avoid any other seasonal flu etc. And the APCS program for 2023 is framed in much the same way. Nearly all of us are multiply vaccinated, and the risks associated with COVID are nowhere nearly as severe as they were a couple of years ago. But COVID is still with us and our activities may have to be modified.

The APCS will comply with any and all rules imposed by the relevant State authorities.

February 19 – 2pm – Meeting and presentation on “Magic Lanterns and their illumination” AMRA Hall

The meeting on 19th February at 2pm at AMRA Hall includes a demonstration of Magic Lanterns and the images of up to 170 years ago. Those Magic Lanterns were very dull and electrification was problematic. New developments in solid state illumination have changed that and this presentation will be at a brightness that you have not seen previously. You will be able to see the new light sources close up and examples of how you might adopt the new technology.

Three projectors from 1870 to 1950 will be on show: a total restoration of a French LAVERNE – one of the pioneers of this form of entertainment, a mature electric “Optiscope” by Butcher from 1926, and a radically different American design made for military usage from 1952.

And don't forget the “free to a good home”, swap and sell table.

March 12 – 9am – Public market at the Box Hill Town Hall

The traditional Box Hill markets are back, and the experience of last year shows that they are as active as ever. Time to sort out all that equipment that you don't need and sell it. There are some legislated rules and insurance conditions, that will restrict some items. Electrical goods that run from the power mains are not permitted to be sold, and there are now exclusions on ANY photographic chemicals.

The APCS has arranged Third Party Liability Insurance for table holders but please note the above restrictions. The March Market is a very popular one so get in early to be assured of your preferred tables.

April 16 – Noon – Members-only auction AMRA Hall

An auction is planned for April and it will be conducted as for pre-COVID times. Inspections from 2pm on Saturday 15th and from 10am on the Sunday morning. All items will be photographed and you will be able to view them from an on-line catalogue. The auction will start at NOON on Sunday. We have a new Auction Manager for 2023 and new procedures are in place.

Goods for the auction must be delivered to Paul Ewins in DONVALE VIC by 26th March, and you should contact Paul on 0403 567544 to get the specific address and discuss any issues. Please note that due to the aging nature of photographic items and the extreme difficulty in assuring working condition, all items for auction will be offered in an “AS-IS” condition, but items that are in a notable cosmetic condition will be offered as such. There will be a total auction limit of 250 items so get in early to be certain of making this auction.

The intent is that the illustrated catalogue will be available on-line on 9th April. Absentee and Phone bidding will be in place, and instructions for that method will be included in the next newsletters.

May 21 – 2pm – Members-only market at AMRA Hall

A now-traditional members-only market will be held at the AMRA Hall on May 21 from 2pm. Bring along your better items to sell to our collecting membership.

June 18 – 2pm – Meeting with Presentation at AMRA Hall

We are looking for a presenter and subject for the June meeting – any subject relevant to the collecting of cameras and photographic equipment. We do have a couple of subjects in reserve but would appreciate some new ideas..

July 16 – 2pm Annual General Meeting AMRA Hall

Our AGM is for the purpose of receiving reports, electing a committee for the next year and dealing with specific items of business to be determined. The Annual Report will be in the pages of Back Focus which is planned to be in the mail to you before the end of June.

The APCS is run by the elected committee and volunteers when they offer. Now that the COVID restrictions are essentially over, what about being part of the revitalisation of the APCS and join the committee. There is plenty to do managing the events as well as ensuring that members are kept up to date with what is happening – via the Newsletter, Back Focus, the Website, the FaceBook page, Advertising for individual events, and being part of the management group that does the planning etc.

In recent years we have not had a ready list of volunteers to call on and it is recognised that unless that changes – and changes quite soon – that the Society will not be able to continue in its present form and may have to cut back very significantly on what we do. It is also observed that the management of an Association like the APCS is taking more total effort than it used, and there are a few skills that are now needed – many of which rely on the thorough grounding in technology.
