



With many important items in his collection he felt an international presentation was required and selected Joel's here in Melbourne. It was a day of gathering for our own members and collectors from everywhere. Peter Coeln from the Leica Shop in Vienna, Austria, John Fryer from the USA, John Moorhouse from Adelaide, Philip Ramsden from Sydney and Sandy Barrie from Brisbane will be a few names from out of town that may be familiar to our members. With a sale total in excess of \$300,000 IBP most items fetched more than the estimate.
