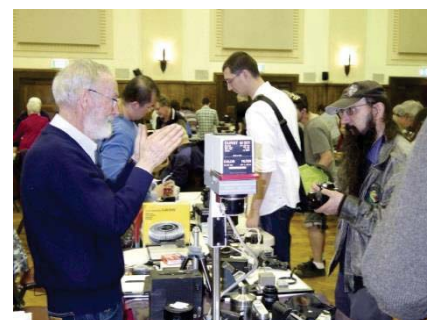


One thing I found interesting this year was a lack of darkroom equipment. I only saw a couple of enlargers, and not much in the way of darkroom accessories.

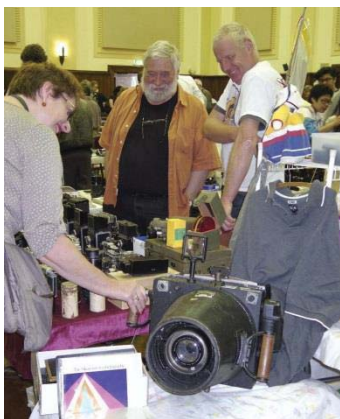
But collectable cameras were also in abundance. I know that many people consider all film cameras to be “collectable” cameras, but there were 2 cameras in particular that stood out for me.

Firstly was the only Canon camera made that took 120 film – the Canon CX-60 X Ray camera made in the mid 1960's. And it even came with a spare film magazine! Price? \$995



The second was a camera being sold by APCS member Dirk Spennemann. Actually you couldn't miss it, seeing it

took 9 inch aerial film! It's a Fairchild K17A made in 1944, and fitted with a Kodak 12 inch lens.
