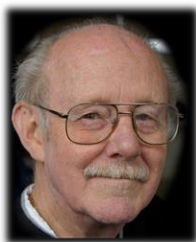
Sadness

Photographic industry news

The photographic industry is a very active one with all sorts of developments becoming almost a daily news story. A few that have come to the attention of APCS news include the following...

New digital cameras... It seems almost impossible to keep up with new releases from the many manufacturers keen to sell you new items. It does not matter if you favour Nikon, Canon, Sony or any other name – the rumour mills are off and rolling. But as is becoming usual, it is the Sony rumours that are getting noticed... But rumours aside, the release of the Sony A7R Mk.IV to reviewers in the last few weeks with the native resolution of 61MP and 240MP in a technical mode show just how far these full frame units are going. But take care, you will also need to get some very special lenses if you are to exploit those resolutions and all-in-all that will take very deep pockets. An A7R Mk.IV with a top 50mm lens to match will make a very big hole in \$7,500 here in Australia.

Photographers beware... Photography is an environment involving a lot of money and practitioners have been the targets of various scams as reported recently – from fraudulent dealing in on-line sales to deception in professional photographic engagements, we all need to be aware that we are targets by those who believe that they need our money more than we do...

Decline in camera sales... 2019 continues the trend in a drop in the number of dedicated cameras produced and sold as the cameras in mobile phones and similar devices continue to dominate the market. Some of the classical marques are reporting disturbingly low sales levels...

The resurgence of film... There have been a few releases of new film, but the news is not all good. Certainly, it has become easier to find new film but users are discovering that there are technical limitations that effectively mean that digital photography is moving leaps and bounds ahead of film in terms of quality and performance in general. In spite of the implication that film is making a comeback, film chemistry is just not keeping up, and observers have pointed out that the total volume of film being produced is not actually increasing and the current enthusiasm may be temporary.
